Home Health Care Warning Signs and Emergency Medical Care Conditions

Warning sign (Warning sign for medical care)

If the child has the following symptoms, telemedicine is required. It is advisable to go out for medical treatment when necessary.

- Fever for more than 48 hours, or high fever > 39 degrees accompanied by chill/cold sweat
- Persistent poor mobility after the fever is gone
- Persistent tachypnea/wheezing or chest tightness, chest pain after the fever is gone
- Persistent vomiting, headache, or abdominal pain
- No food or urine for more than 12 hours

Rushed to hospital by Rescue 119, or rushed to hospital on your own in an emergency

If the child has the following symptoms, please dial 119, or have the relatives/friends who live together take the child to the hospital in an emergency.

- Cold limbs accompanied by mottled skin and cold sweat
- Difficulty in breathing or having a funnel chest
- Oxygen saturation below 94%
- Lips turn white or purple
- Poor consciousness
- Twitch
